

#### PARTICIPATION



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#### INAUGURAL SESSION





After that the Principal cum Chairperson of the webinar, Dr. Bibhas Chandra Saha, welcomed the guests and delivered the Chairperson's Speech. He extended a warm welcome to all the resource persons and the viewers and expressed his gratitude to the guests for gracing the occasion. The inaugural session ended with the Convener's Speech in which Dr. Soumya Mohan Ghosh remarked that even after more than four decades since the United Nations first celebrated International Women's Day in the year 1975 following the publication of "Towards Equality" report in 1974 gender continued to remain one of the important markers in our society. The historical process of constructing gender identity, he opined, was a continuous phenomenon that can be found reflected in literature, society, and culture, as well as in films which were the integral part of any society and culture. He said that women were either celebrated as desexualized elevated beings or devalued as over-sexualized seductresses. However, over the years, he was of the opinion that gender had become a contested domain as more and more women were trying to address the issues related to women, but, the issues of women of color, Asian women, lesbian, queer, trans-women still needed critical attention. He concluded his speech by saying that the event aspired to address some of those issues.



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#### **SESSION 2**




