



#### CC1A: Poetry and Short Story

However, students can be given a chance to get acquainted with one of the Metaphysical poets, and for this purpose either John Donne's "The Good Morrow" or Andrew Marvell's "To His Coy Mistress" can be added with the rest of the syllabus.

#### CC1B: Essay, Drama and Novel

The syllabus needs some revision. William Shakespeare's "Macbeth" or "Hamlet" or "King Lear" needs to be added in place of J. B. Priestly's "An Inspector Calls" as the students should be provided with an opportunity to study Shakespeare's one of the great tragedies. The students can be exposed to the 19<sup>th</sup> century novels of Jane Austen as well, and "Pride and Prejudice" can be added as a non-detail text.






